Ettore Bastianini Is Dead at 43; Baritone Performed With Met

Sung Roles in Last 4 Years While Stricken With Cancer -Triumphed With Callas

SIRMIONE, Italy, Jan. 26 (AP)-Ettore Bastianini, leading operatic baritone, died last night at a clinic in this Lake Garda resort. He was 43 years old.

Mr. Bastianini sang several seasons with New York's Metropolitan Opera.

A Courageous Voice

Mr. Bastianini had been suffering from cancer of the vocal cords and epiglottis for four years, but he would not allow his affliction to be made public while he was alive, his physician, Louis Perrotta, said in New York yesterday.
